1 Chronicles 18:1-17 Nations David conquered who brought him tribute

David's Further Conquests (2 Samuel 8:1-14)

- After this it came to pass that David attacked the Philistines, subdued them, and took Gath and its towns from the hand of the Philistines.
- 2 Then he defeated Moab, and the Moabites became David's servants, and brought tribute.
- ³ And David defeated Hadadezer king of Zobah as far as Hamath, as he went to establish his power by the River Euphrates.
- ⁴ David took from him one thousand chariots, seven thousand horsemen, and twenty thousand foot soldiers. Also David hamstrung all the chariot horses, except that he spared enough of them for one hundred chariots
- ⁵ When the Syrians of Damascus came to help Hadadezer king of Zobah, David killed twenty-two thousand of the Syrians.
- ⁶ Then David put garrisons in Syria of Damascus; and the Syrians became David's servants, and brought tribute. So Yahweh (the Lord) preserved David wherever he went.
- ⁷ And David took the shields of gold that were on the servants of Hadadezer, and brought them to Jerusalem.
- 8 Also from Tibhath and from Chun, cities of Hadadezer, David brought a large amount of bronze, with which Solomon made the bronze Sea, the pillars, and the articles of bronze.
- 9 Now when Tou king of Hamath heard that David had defeated all the army of Hadadezer king of Zobah, 10 he sent Hadoram his son to King David, to greet him and bless him, because he had fought against Hadadezer and defeated him (for Hadadezer had been at war with Tou); and Hadoram brought with him all kinds of articles of gold, silver, and bronze.
- II King David also dedicated these to Yahweh (the Lord), along with the silver and gold that he had brought from all these nations from Edom, from Moab, from the people of Ammon, from the Philistines, and from Amalek.
- 12 Moreover Abishai the son of Zeruiah killed eighteen thousand Edomites in the Valley of Salt.
 13 He also put garrisons in Edom, and all the Edomites became David's servants. And Yahweh (the Lord) preserved David wherever he went.

David's Administration (2 Samuel 8:15-18)

- 14 So David reigned over all Israel, and administered judgment and justice to all his people.
- 15 Joab the son of Zeruiah was over the army; Jehoshaphat the son of Ahilud was recorder;
- 16 Zadok the son of Ahitub and Abimelech the son of Abiathar were the priests; Shavsha was the scribe;
- 17 Benaiah the son of Jehoiada was over the Cherethites and the Pelethites; and David's sons were chief ministers at the king's side.

Facts Revealed:

♦ Yahweh preserved David wherever he went. [1 Chronicles 18:13]

- ♦ David defeated all the lands designated as the land of Israel from the Euphrates River to the land of the south possessed by the people of Amalek described as the borders of Israel for the Kingdom Age in Ezekiel chapters 47 & 48. [1 Chronicles 18:1-13]
 - ☐ Amalek was the nation that came out to fight against Israel at Rephidim when Israel left Mount Horeb on its way to the Promised Land. [Exodus 17:8-13]
- ♦ It included a large part of Syria from the Mediterranean Sea to the River Euphrates as far east as Damascus, all of Lebanon, all of Israel including that east of the Jordan River, the people of Ammon, Moab, Edom, and Amalek.
- ♦ The people of all these lands became servants of David and brought him tribute.
- ♦ David amassed great amounts of bronze, gold, and silver which he set aside for the future building of the Temple of Yahweh. [1 Chronicles 18:7-11]
