2 Chronicles 30:1-27 Hezekiah's Great Passover Celebration

Hezekiah Keeps the Passover

- And Hezekiah sent to all Israel and Judah, and also wrote letters to Ephraim and Manasseh, that they should come to Beit Yahweh (the house of the Lord) at Jerusalem, to keep the Passover to Yahweh Elohey Yisrael (the Lord God of Israel).
- ² For the king and his leaders and all the assembly in Jerusalem had agreed to keep the Passover in the second month.
- ³ For they could not keep it at the regular time, because a sufficient number of priests had not consecrated themselves, nor had the people gathered together at Jerusalem.
- 4 And the matter pleased the king and all the assembly.
- ⁵ So they resolved to make a proclamation throughout all Israel, from Beersheba to Dan, that they should come to keep the Passover to Yahweh Elohey Yisrael (the Lord God of Israel) at Jerusalem, since they had not done it for a long time in the prescribed manner.
- 6 Then the runners went throughout all Israel and Judah with the letters from the king and his leaders, and spoke according to the command of the king: "Children of Israel, return to Yahweh Elohey (the Lord God of) Abraham, Isaac, and Israel; then He will return to the remnant of you who have escaped from the hand of the kings of Assyria.
- ⁷ And do not be like your fathers and your brethren, who trespassed against Yahweh Elohey (the Lord God of) their fathers, so that He gave them up to desolation, as you see.
- 8 Now do not be stiff-necked, as your fathers were, but yield yourselves to Yahweh (the Lord); and enter His sanctuary, which He has sanctified forever, and serve Yahweh Eloheykm (the Lord your God), that the fierceness of His wrath may turn away from you.
- 9 For if you return to Yahweh (the Lord), your brethren and your children will be treated with compassion by those who lead them captive, so that they may come back to this land; for Yahweh Eloheykm (the Lord your God) is gracious and merciful, and will not turn His face from you if you return to Him."
- 10 So the runners passed from city to city through the country of Ephraim and Manasseh, as far as Zebulun; but they laughed at them and mocked them.
- 11 Nevertheless some from Asher, Manasseh, and Zebulun humbled themselves and came to Jerusalem.
- 12 Also the hand of Elohiym (God) was on Judah to give them singleness of heart to obey the command of the king and the leaders, at the word of Yahweh (the Lord).
- 13 Now many people, a very great assembly, gathered at Jerusalem to keep the Feast of Unleavened Bread in the second month.
- 14 They arose and took away the altars that were in Jerusalem, and they took away all the incense altars and cast them into the Brook Kidron.
- 15 Then they slaughtered the Passover lambs on the fourteenth day of the second month. The priests and the Levites were ashamed, and sanctified themselves, and brought the burnt offerings to Beit Yahweh (the house of the Lord).
- 16 They stood in their place according to their custom, according to the Law of Moses the man of Elohiym (God); the priests sprinkled the blood received from the hand of the Levites.
- 17 For there were many in the assembly who had not sanctified themselves; therefore the Levites had charge of the slaughter of the Passover lambs for everyone who was not clean, to sanctify them

to Yahweh (the Lord).

- 18 For a multitude of the people, many from Ephraim, Manasseh, Issachar, and Zebulun, had not cleansed themselves, yet they ate the Passover contrary to what was written. But Hezekiah prayed for them, saying, "May the good Yahweh (Lord) provide atonement for everyone 19 who prepares his heart to seek Elohiym Yahweh Elohey (God, the Lord God of) his fathers, though he is not cleansed according to the purification of the sanctuary."
- 20 And the Lord listened to Hezekiah and healed the people.
- 21 So the children of Israel who were present at Jerusalem kept the Feast of Unleavened Bread seven days with great gladness; and the Levites and the priests praised Yahweh (the Lord) day by day, singing to Yahweh (the Lord), accompanied by loud instruments.
- 22 And Hezekiah gave encouragement to all the Levites who taught the good knowledge of Yahweh (the Lord); and they are throughout the feast seven days, offering peace offerings and making confession to Yahweh Elohey (the Lord God of) their fathers.
- 23 Then the whole assembly agreed to keep the feast another seven days, and they kept it another seven days with gladness.
- ²⁴ For Hezekiah king of Judah gave to the assembly a thousand bulls and seven thousand sheep, and the leaders gave to the assembly a thousand bulls and ten thousand sheep; and a great number of priests sanctified themselves.
- 25 The whole assembly of Judah rejoiced, also the priests and Levites, all the assembly that came from Israel, the sojourners who came from the land of Israel, and those who dwelt in Judah.
- ²⁶ So there was great joy in Jerusalem, for since the time of Solomon the son of David, king of Israel, there had been nothing like this in Jerusalem.
- 27 Then the priests, the Levites, arose and blessed the people, and their voice was heard; and their prayer came up to His holy dwelling place, to heaven.

Facts Revealed:

Hezekiah Keeps the Passover

- ➡ Hezekiah sent to all Israel and Judah, and also wrote letters to Ephraim and Manasseh, that
 they should come to Beit Yahweh (the house of the Lord) at Jerusalem, to keep the Passover
 to Yahweh Elohey Yisrael (the Lord God of Israel). [2 Chronicles 30:1]
 - ♦ Hezekiah not only wanted to bring the southern kingdom of Judah over which he had been made king back to worship of Yahweh, but also all of Israel including the northern kingdom which had been in rebellion against Yahweh from the time the kingdom had been divided under Jeroboam and Rehoboam after the death of Solomon because Solomon had turned away from Yahweh to idolatry to pacify his many pagan wives. [1 Kings 11:1 through 12:24, 2 Chronicles 10:1-18]
 - ♦ Hezekiah sent invitations to all of Israel and Judah and wrote letters to Ephraim and Manasseh calling them to join together to celebrate Passover in Jerusalem.
 - ♦ Passover could not be celebrated at its appointed time on the fourteenth day in the first month because there were not enough priests consecrated to do the service and the people had not gathered in Jerusalem. [2 Chronicles 30:3, Exodus 12:1-11, 14-20]
 - ♦ Yahweh made an exception for those who were not able to keep the Passover in its
 appointed time in the first month and allowed them to keep the Passover on the fourteenth
 day of the second month. [Numbers 9:6-14]

- ♦ Hezekiah and his leaders with all the assembly in Jerusalem agreed to keep the Passover in the second month because they could not keep it in the first month. [2 Chronicles 30:2-5]
- ♦ In his letter Hezekiah called for all Israel to return to Yahweh and He will return to you. [2 Chronicles 30:6-9]
- ♦ The runners passed through the cities of Israel as far as Zebulun but the people laughed at them and mocked them. [2 Chronicles 30:10]
- ♦ However some from Asher, Manasseh, and Zebulun accepted the invitation and came to Jerusalem. [2 Chronicles 30:11]
- ♦ The hand of Yahweh was on the people of Judah and gave them a heart to obey the command of the king and leaders. [2 Chronicles 30:12]
- ♦ A very great assembly gathered in Jerusalem to keep the Passover and the feast of Unleavened Bread in the second month. [2 Chronicles 30:13]
- → They took away all the altars and incense altars in Jerusalem and cast them into the Brook Kidron. [2 Chronicles 30:14]
- → They slaughtered the Passover lambs on the fourteenth day of the second month. [2
 Chronicles 30:15-17]
- ♦ A multitude from Ephraim, Manasseh, Issachar, and Zebulun had not cleansed themselves yet they ate the Passover, but Hezekiah prayed for them and Yahweh listened to Hezekiah and healed them. [2 Chronicles 30:18-20]
- ♦ They kept the feast of Unleavened Bread for seven days with great gladness. [2 Chronicles 30:21-22]
- ♦ Then the whole assembly agreed to keep the feast another seven days, and they kept it with great gladness, Hezekiah and the leaders provided the bulls and sheep in great numbers. [2 Chronicles 30:23-24]
- ♦ There was great joy in Jerusalem for there had been nothing like this since the time of Solomon. [2 Chronicles 30:25-26]
- ♦ Then the priests, the Levites, arose and blessed the people, and their voice was heard; and their prayer came up to Yahweh's holy dwelling place, to heaven. [2 Chronicles 30:27]
