

Exodus 6:28 - - 7:7 **God sends Moses and Aaron back to Pharaoh**

28 And it came to pass, on the day the LORD spoke to Moses in the land of Egypt, 29 that the LORD spoke to Moses, saying, "I am the LORD. Speak to Pharaoh king of Egypt all that I say to you." 30 But Moses said before the LORD, "Behold, I am of uncircumcised lips, and how shall Pharaoh heed me?"

Exodus 7:1-7

1 So the LORD said to Moses: "See, I have made you as God to Pharaoh, and Aaron your brother shall be your prophet. 2 You shall speak all that I command you. And Aaron your brother shall speak to Pharaoh, to send the children of Israel out of his land. 3 And I will harden Pharaoh's heart, and multiply My signs and My wonders in the land of Egypt. 4 But Pharaoh will not heed you, so that I may lay My hand on Egypt and bring My armies and My people, the children of Israel, out of the land of Egypt by great judgments. 5 And the Egyptians shall know that I am the LORD, when I stretch out My hand on Egypt and bring out the children of Israel from among them." 6 Then Moses and Aaron did so; just as the LORD commanded them, so they did. 7 And Moses was eighty years old and Aaron eighty-three years old when they spoke to Pharaoh. NKJV

Facts Revealed:

- ✧ God spoke to Moses in Egypt and told him to speak to Pharaoh all that God shall say to him.
- ✧ Moses, discouraged by Pharaoh's previous response to the request to let Israel go, pleads out saying, "I am of uncircumcised lips, how shall Pharaoh heed me?"
- ✧ Yehowah responded and said to Moses, "See, **I have made you as God to Pharaoh, and Aaron your brother shall be your prophet.** Thus establishing that God's words spoken by Moses and Aaron will carry a far greater authority than that of Pharaoh himself.
- ✧ Moses is to speak to Aaron all that God commands, and Aaron shall speak to Pharaoh, to the intent that he must send the Children of Israel out of his land.
- ✧ Then God advises Moses that God Himself will harden Pharaoh's heart, and multiply God's own signs and wonders in the land of Egypt.
- ✧ Pharaoh's refusal will provide the opportunity for God to lay his hand on Egypt and bring His armies and His people, the Children of Israel, out of the land of Egypt by great judgments.

The plagues to follow are **judgments of God** against all the gods of Egypt, to demonstrate that the Egyptian's gods are nothing, compared to the God of Israel, Who truly is God.

- ✧ "And the Egyptians will know that I am Yehowah, when I stretch out My hand on Egypt and bring out the Children of Israel from among them."
- ✧ God's purpose is very clear, and that is to demonstrate to Egypt, and to the world, that idolatry is based on faulty doctrine, and can not stand up against the God of creation.
- ✧ Moses and Aaron did just as Yehowah commanded them.
- ✧ **Moses was 80 years old and Aaron was 83 years old when they spoke to Pharaoh.**
