Simon the Leper, a Pharisee, Mary, Martha, Lazarus, Judas Iscariot

Anointing in Bethany

Matt 26:6-13

6 And when Jesus was in **Bethany at the house of Simon the leper**, 7 a woman (Mary) came to Him having an alabaster flask of very costly fragrant oil, and she poured it on His head as He sat at the table. 8 But when His disciples saw it, they were indignant, saying, "Why this waste? 9 For this fragrant oil might have been sold for much and given to the poor."

10 But when Jesus was aware of it, He said to them, "Why do you trouble the woman? For she has done a good work for Me. 11 For you have the poor with you always, but Me you do not have always. 12 For in pouring this fragrant oil on My body, she did it for My burial. 13 Assuredly, I say to you, wherever this gospel is preached in the whole world, what this woman has done will also be told as a memorial to her."

Mark 14:3-9

3 And being in **Bethany at the house of Simon the leper**, as He sat at the table, a woman (Mary) came having an alabaster flask of very costly oil of spikenard. Then she broke the flask and poured it on His head. 4 But there were some who were indignant among themselves, and said, "Why was this fragrant oil wasted? 5 For it might have been sold for more than three hundred denarii and given to the poor." And they criticized her sharply.

6 But Jesus said, "Let her alone. Why do you trouble her? She has done a good work for Me. 7 For you have the poor with you always, and whenever you wish you may do them good; but Me you do not have always. 8 She has done what she could. She has come beforehand to anoint My body for burial. 9 Assuredly, I say to you, wherever this gospel is preached in the whole world, what this woman has done will also be told as a memorial to her."

Luke 7:36-50

36 Then one of the **Pharisees asked Him to eat with him**. And He went to **the Pharisee's house, and sat down to eat.** 37 And behold, a woman (Mary) in the city who was a sinner, when she knew that Jesus sat at the table in the Pharisee's house, brought an alabaster flask of fragrant oil, 38 and stood at His feet behind Him weeping; and she began to wash His feet with her tears, and wiped them with the hair of her head; and she kissed His feet and anointed them with the fragrant oil. 39 Now when the Pharisee who had invited Him saw this, he spoke to himself, saying, "This Man, if He were a prophet, would know who and what manner of woman this is who is touching Him, for she is a sinner."

40 And Jesus answered and said to him, "Simon, I have something to say to you."

So he said, "Teacher, say it."

- 41 "There was a certain creditor who had two debtors. One owed five hundred denarii, and the other fifty. 42 And when they had nothing with which to repay, he freely forgave them both. Tell Me, therefore, which of them will love him more?"
- 43 **Simon** answered and said, "I suppose the one whom he forgave more. "Luke 7:43-50

And He said to him, "You have rightly judged." 44 Then He turned to the woman and said to Simon, "Do you see this woman? I entered your house; you gave Me no water for My feet, but she has washed My feet with her tears and wiped them with the hair of her head. 45 You gave Me no kiss, but this woman has not ceased to kiss My feet since the time I came in. 46 You did not anoint My head with oil, but this woman has anointed My feet with fragrant oil. 47 Therefore I say to you, her sins, which are many, are forgiven, for she loved much. But to whom little is forgiven, the same loves little."

- 48 Then He said to her, "Your sins are forgiven."
- 49 And those who sat at the table with Him began to say to themselves, "Who is this who even forgives sins?"

50 Then He said to the woman, "Your faith has saved you. Go in peace." NKJV

John 12:1-7

1 Then, six days before the Passover, Jesus came to **Bethany, where Lazarus was who had been dead, whom He had raised from the dead**. 2 There **they made Him a supper; and Martha served**, but **Lazarus was one of those who sat at the table with Him**. 3 Then **Mary** took a pound of very costly oil of spikenard, anointed the feet of Jesus, and wiped His feet with her hair. And the house was filled with the fragrance of the oil.

4 But one of His disciples, **Judas Iscariot**, **Simon's son**, who would betray Him, said, 5 "Why was this fragrant oil not sold for three hundred denarii and given to the poor?" 6 This he said, not that he cared for the poor, but because he was a thief, and had the money box; and he used to take what was put in it.

7 But Jesus said, "Let her alone; she has kept this for the day of My burial. 8 For the poor you have with you always, but Me you do not have always."

Judas identified as Son of Simon

John 6:70-71

70 Jesus answered them, "Did I not choose you, the twelve, and one of you is a devil?" 71 **He spoke of Judas Iscariot, the son of Simon**, for it was he who would betray Him, being one of the twelve.

Lazarus sick in Bethany

John 11:1-44

- 11 Now a certain man was sick, Lazarus of Bethany, the town of Mary and her sister Martha. 2 It was that Mary who anointed the Lord with fragrant oil and wiped His feet with her hair, whose brother Lazarus was sick. 3 Therefore the sisters sent to Him, saying, "Lord, behold, he whom You love is sick."
- 4 When Jesus heard that, He said, "This sickness is not unto death, but for the glory of God, that the Son of God may be glorified through it."
- 5 Now Jesus loved **Martha and her sister and Lazarus**. 6 So, when He heard that he was sick, He stayed two more days in the place where He was. 7 Then after this He said to the disciples, "Let us go to Judea again."
- 8 The disciples said to Him, "Rabbi, lately the Jews sought to stone You, and are You going there again?"
- 9 Jesus answered, "Are there not twelve hours in the day? If anyone walks in the day, he does not stumble, because he sees the light of this world. 10 But if one walks in the night, he stumbles, because the light is not in him." 11 These things He said, and after that He said to them, "Our friend Lazarus sleeps, but I go that I may wake him up."
- 12 Then His disciples said, "Lord, if he sleeps he will get well." 13 However, Jesus spoke of his death, but they thought that He was speaking about taking rest in sleep.
- 14 Then Jesus said to them plainly, "Lazarus is dead. 15 And I am glad for your sakes that I was not there, that you may believe. Nevertheless let us go to him."
- 16 Then Thomas, who is called the Twin, said to his fellow disciples, "Let us also go, that we may die with Him."
- 17 So when Jesus came, He found that he had already been in the tomb four days. 18 Now **Bethany** was near Jerusalem, about two miles away. 19 And many of the Jews had joined the women around **Martha and Mary**, to comfort them concerning **their brother**.
- 20 Now **Martha**, as soon as she heard that Jesus was coming, went and met Him, but Mary was sitting in the house. 21 Now **Martha** said to Jesus, "Lord, if You had been here, **my brother** would not have died. 22 But even now I know that whatever You ask of God, God will give You."
- 23 Jesus said to her, "Your brother will rise again."
- 24 Martha said to Him, "I know that he will rise again in the resurrection at the last day."
- 25 Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in Me, though he may die, he shall live. 26 And whoever lives and believes in Me shall never die. Do you believe this?"
- 27 She said to Him, "Yes, Lord, I believe that You are the Christ, the Son of God, who is to come into the world."
- 28 And when she had said these things, she went her way and secretly called **Mary her sister**, saying, "The Teacher has come and is calling for you." 29 As soon as she heard that, she arose quickly and came to Him.
- 30 Now Jesus had not yet come into the town, but was in the place where Martha met Him. 31 Then the Jews who were with her in the house, and comforting her, when they saw that Mary rose up quickly and went out, followed her, saying, "She is going to the tomb to weep there."

- 32 Then, when **Mary** came where Jesus was, and saw Him, she fell down at His feet, saying to Him, "Lord, if You had been here, **my brother** would not have died."
- 33 Therefore, when Jesus saw her weeping, and the Jews who came with her weeping, He groaned in the spirit and was troubled. 34 And He said, "Where have you laid him?" They said to Him, "Lord, come and see."
- 35 Jesus wept. 36 Then the Jews said, "See how He loved him!"
- 37 And some of them said, "Could not this Man, who opened the eyes of the blind, also have kept this man from dying?"

Lazarus Raised from the Dead

38 Then Jesus, again groaning in Himself, came to the tomb. It was a cave, and a stone lay against it. 39 Jesus said, "Take away the stone."

Martha, the sister of him who was dead, said to Him, "Lord, by this time there is a stench, for he has been dead four days."

40 Jesus said to her, "Did I not say to you that if you would believe you would see the glory of God?" 41 Then they took away the stone from the place where the dead man was lying. And Jesus lifted up His eyes and said, "Father, I thank You that You have heard Me. 42 And I know that You always hear Me, but because of the people who are standing by I said this, that they may believe that You sent Me." 43 Now when He had said these things, He cried with a loud voice, "Lazarus, come forth!" 44 And he who had died came out bound hand and foot with graveclothes, and his face was wrapped with a cloth. Jesus said to them, "Loose him, and let him go."

The Plot to Kill Jesus

(Matt 26:1-5; Mark 14:1,2; Luke 22:1,2)

John 11:45-48

45 Then many of the Jews who had come to Mary, and had seen the things Jesus did, believed in Him. 46 But some of them went away to the Pharisees and told them the things Jesus did. 47 Then the chief priests and the Pharisees gathered a council and said, "What shall we do? For this Man works many signs. 48 If we let Him alone like this, everyone will believe in Him, and the Romans will come and take away both our place and nation."

The Plot to Kill Lazarus

(Matt 21:1-11; Mark 11:1-11; Luke 19:28-40)

John 12:9-11

9 Now a great many of the Jews knew that He was there; and they came, not for Jesus' sake only, but that they might also see Lazarus, whom He had raised from the dead. 10 But **the chief priests plotted to put Lazarus to death also,** 11 **because on account of him many of the Jews went away and believed in Jesus.**NKJV
