Genesis 49:1-33 Jacob blesses the twelve tribes of Israel

1 And Jacob called his sons and said, "Gather together, that I may tell you what shall befall you in the last days:

² "Gather together and hear, you sons of Jacob, And listen to Israel your father.

³ "Reuben, you are my firstborn, My might and the beginning of my strength, The excellency of dignity and the excellency of power. ⁴ Unstable as water, you shall not excel, Because you went up to your father's bed; Then you defiled it--He went up to my couch.

⁵ "Simeon and Levi are brothers; Instruments of cruelty are in their dwelling place. ⁶ Let not my soul enter their council; Let not my honor be united to their assembly; For in their anger they slew a man, And in their self-will they hamstrung an ox. ⁷ Cursed be their anger, for it is fierce; And their wrath, for it is cruel! I will divide them in Jacob And scatter them in Israel.

⁸ "Judah, you are he whom your brothers shall praise; Your hand shall be on the neck of your enemies; Your father's children shall bow down before you. ⁹ Judah is a lion's whelp; From the prey, my son, you have gone up. He bows down, he lies down as a lion; And as a lion, who shall rouse him? ¹⁰ The scepter shall not depart from Judah, Nor a lawgiver from between his feet, Until Shiloh comes; And to Him shall be the obedience of the people. ¹¹ Binding his donkey to the vine, And his donkey's colt to the choice vine, He washed his garments in wine, And his clothes in the blood of grapes. ¹² His eyes are darker than wine, And his teeth whiter than milk.

¹³ "Zebulun shall dwell by the haven of the sea; He shall become a haven for ships, And his border shall adjoin Sidon.

¹⁴ "Issachar is a strong donkey, Lying down between two burdens; ¹⁵ He saw that rest was good, And that the land was pleasant; He bowed his shoulder to bear a burden, And became a band of slaves.

¹⁶ "Dan shall judge his people As one of the tribes of Israel. ¹⁷ Dan shall be a serpent by the way, A viper by the path, That bites the horse's heels So that its rider shall fall backward. ¹⁸ I have waited for your salvation, O LORD!

19 "Gad, a troop shall tramp upon him, But he shall triumph at last.

20 "Bread from Asher shall be rich, And he shall yield royal dainties.

21 "Naphtali is a deer let loose; He uses beautiful words.

²² "Joseph is a fruitful bough, A fruitful bough by a well; His branches run over the wall. ²³ The archers have bitterly grieved him, Shot at him and hated him. ²⁴ But his bow remained in strength, And the arms of his hands were made strong By the hands of the Mighty God of Jacob (From there is the Shepherd, the Stone of Israel), ²⁵ By the God of your father who will help you, And by the Almighty who will bless you With blessings of heaven above, Blessings of the deep that lies beneath, Blessings of the breasts and of the womb. ²⁶ The blessings of your father Have excelled the blessings of my ancestors, Up to the utmost bound of the everlasting hills. They shall be on the head of Joseph, And on the crown of the head of him who was separate from his brothers.

27 "Benjamin is a ravenous wolf; In the morning he shall devour the prey, And at night he shall divide the spoil."

²⁸ All these are the twelve tribes of Israel, and this is what their father spoke to them. And he blessed them; he blessed each one according to his own blessing.

²⁹ Then he charged them and said to them: "I am to be gathered to my people; bury me with my fathers in the cave that is in the field of Ephron the Hittite, ³⁰ in the cave that is in the field of Machpelah, which is before Mamre in the land of Canaan, which Abraham bought with the field of Ephron the Hittite as a possession for a burial place. ³¹ There they buried Abraham and Sarah his wife, there they buried Isaac and Rebekah his wife, and there I buried Leah. ³² The field and the cave that is there were purchased from the sons of Heth." ³³ And when Jacob had finished

commanding his sons, he drew his feet up into the bed and breathed his last, and was gathered to his people. NKJV

Facts Revealed:

- \Rightarrow The prophetic blessing is focused on the last days.
- Because Reuben went up to his father's bed and defiled it by having sexual relations with Bilhah his father's concubine, [Genesis 35:22] Jacob remembered the affair and held it against Reuben and said that Reuben was unstable as water and would not excel.
- ★ With Simeon and Levi, Jacob remembered their violence in the affair with Shechem and his town as they slaughtered all the men of the place because Shechem had lain with Dinah their sister. Jacob said, cursed be their anger, I will divide them in Israel. It happened that these two tribes were divided in the land of Israel as the descendants of Levi were scattered among all the tribes of Israel as priests and Levites instructing in the Law of God and having no inheritance except the sacrifices and tithes of the other tribes. [Joshua 18:7] Simeon inherited among the tribe of Judah. [Joshua 19:9]
- ✤ Judah will be the royal leader of Israel, his brothers will bow down before him, he will crush his enemies. The scepter shall not depart from Judah nor a lawgiver from between his feet until Shiloh (place of rest, the exact image of God) comes. This is a direct reference to the Universal Peace that will accompany the Kingdom age when righteousness and justice will rule the earth under the reign of the Messiah for a thousand years. [Isaiah 11:1-13, Isaiah 2:1-5, Micah 4:1-5, 2 Corinthians 4:4] Washing His garments in wine and his clothes in the blood of grapes is a reference to the wrath of God in the Great Tribulation. [Revelation 19:11-16]
- ☆ Jacob gave a brief blessing to the rest of his sons and an elaborate one to Joseph, but when he came to Dan, he added, "I have waited for Your Salvation O Yehowah!"
- ☆ When he finished commanding his sons, Jacob drew his feet up into the bed and breathed his last, and was gathered to his people.
